Auditor Kovack Announces Seals Design Award Winners

Medina County Auditor Mike Kovack announced the 12 winners of the 2022 Annual Weights and Measures Seal Design Contest yesterday at an awards ceremony held at the Medina County Career Center Café.

Milo Weaver and Morgan Campbell, both Medina County Career Center (MCCC) students, took home first-place awards in the “Price Verification” and “Inspected and Sealed” categories, respectively, besting more than 100 other entries. Weaver (whose home school is Brunswick High School) and Campbell (whose home school is Highland High School) will have their designs featured on gas pumps and cash registers throughout the county. They each received a \$75 prize.

Finalists for the “Inspected and Sealed” award were Travis Svendsen of MCCC and Brunswick High School; Ian Schuler of Highland High School; Trisha Lamphear of MCCC and Black River High School; Kyra Weitzel of MCCC and Brunswick High School; and Sarah Fisher of MCCC and Brunswick High School.

Finalists for the “Price Verification” category were Magdalena Peters of MCCC and Buckeye High School; Kylie Sikora of MCCC and Brunswick High School; Kailey O’Callaghan of MCCC and Medina High School; Keldin Hupcej of MCCC and Buckeye High School; and Tyler Sasala of MCCC and Brunswick High School. The designs of all the finalists will also be featured on measuring devices throughout the county and the names of all winning students will appear on their respective seals.

“Medina County is tremendously fortunate to have extremely talented students in our school systems,” said Kovack. “We are delighted that they are able to assist us every year with this very prominent function of the Auditor’s office.”

The Weights and Measures program, overseen by Kovack, is a state-mandated program to ensure that all devices are working properly in the county and to ensure consumers buy with confidence.
